Malines, 19th May 1811

Studying theology at the seminary in Ghent.

My very dear Nephew,

I learn with pleasure that you are to receive Holy Orders¹ and will thus be irrevocably consecrated to the Sacred Ministry. I do not doubt that it was obedience which made you take this step so soon and consequently I can only applaud. In submitting to one's superiors one is following the will of God. I am quite annoyed that I did not know ten days earlier that your Bishop was going to confer Holy Orders on Wednesday. I would have asked him to include candidates from my Seminary. If you know that there is going to be another ordination before the holidays I would be very pleased to know in advance.

I am delighted that my nephew Van Den Hende has returned to the Seminary: I pray that the Good Lord may guide him in all his ways and that he might become a worthy priest of his Church. Please tell him that his letter pleased me and that I urge him to persevere.

Like you, my dear nephew, I wish to meet and talk, and I really hope that the summer holidays will present an opportunity; in the meantime may it be as pleases the Good Lord, and I will try always in my letters to answer what you see fit to ask me. I will ask my holy daughters to pray for a good outcome to your ordination and I will do the same as long as you do not forget me before the Good Lord.
